Did you know that early outdoor education is attributed to inspiring imagination and the development



of critical thinking skills? This helps encourage better left brain/right brain development. Studies have shown this to be true. Whether it's Orion's great outdoor environment or the dedicated staff at its school, there is local genius in the St. Joseph's students who competed in the Engineering Society of Detroit's "Future Cities" Competition. Waste Management participated as a judge in the competition, paying close attention to the recycled materials used to build the model cities. Attention was also given to the concepts demonstrated around waste management and recycling, which the students were also required to incorporate into their future cities.

The Michigan Regional Future City Competition has been taking place for nine years. Future City is a cross-curricular educational program where students in 6th, 7th and 8th grades imagine, design and build cities of the future. In 2013, the theme required students to design a city including recycling as a major component and Waste Management assisted in developing the judging criteria. In 2014, the theme was Tomorrow's Transit: Designing a way to move people in and around a city. Student imagination was absolutely astounding.
