# Working towards the highest value

In order to facilitate new cell development, Waste Management will be removing the wooded areas at the west side of the site. For the last two years, Waste Management has facilitated local



harvesting of native forest floor plant species such as meadow rue, may apples, wild geraniums and penn sedge, a grass that grows well in the shade.

Also, in an effort to seek the highest value/repurposing of the wood in the areas to be cleared, WM met with a professional forester to assess the value of the timber in these wooded areas. Over the many years that the site has been active, first as a sand and gravel mining operation and then as a landfill, these areas have gone through frequent disturbance. As a result, the forest growth is considered



immature and lacking enough value to harvest for lumber. The wood that can best be harvested for fuel or other repurposing will be determined by the tree clearing firm contracted by Waste Management.
